Principal's Message . . .

Same issues...New challenges

In 7th grade I had a crush on an 8th grade girl. She was everything a 7th grade boy could ever hope for . . . and WAY out of my league. But, mustering the courage, I passed a note to her in the hallway between classes. It read: "I like you. If you like me check this box." In retrospect, though genuine and naïve, my actions were probably not the best way to express my interest and establish a relationship.

What happened next, however, has been occurring since the dawn of time – that 8th grade girl showed the note to her friends! They, in turn, passed it to the 8th grade boys, who, in turn, wasted no time in reminding me that I was in 7th grade and had no business talking to an 8th grade girl. I was devastated!

The embarrassment passed in time, and the note exists now only in my memory (and perhaps in the minds of a few others). But I often think about how this kind of situation plays out with today's technology. What would happen if I texted the girl and she in turn, immediately forwarded my text to her contacts, who forwarded it to their contacts, and within moments, my naïve interests were broadcasted to hundreds of people instead of a dozen? What if I emailed her and she posted my message on her Facebook page? What if someone took a picture of me crying and sent it out among my school-mates?

While the issues of our youth are essentially the same issues today's children face, the immediacy of new technology, the appeal and process of social networks, and the exponential growth of new tools, iPhone applications, and web sites create new challenges for us as parents and educators.

At times, events may take place outside of school that have reverberating impact inside our school. Cyber-bullying, intimidation, threats, fights, or slander against school employees – whether verbal, physical, or electronic in nature – are serious issues that we address in our efforts to provide a safe and positive school environment. There is, however, a distinction between addressing an issue and issuing consequences. Mr. Steen and I investigate all reported cases and make further determination if events that occur outside of the school day have caused a substantial disruption within our school. This process may include interviewing students, viewing text messages, reading emails, or assessing content on Facebook or other social network sites.

When an incident disrupts the school environment, we have a responsibility to communicate concerns to students and parents and help in the resolution of conflict, as well as to educate our students about the impact of these new technologies and their choices. These actions are an important part of building responsible and mature young adults. Consequences may or may not be a component of the school's response based upon the specifics of each case, the guiding policies, and legal precedents. In any event, the end goal is to help our students learn from their mistakes and develop an understanding of how to navigate the new challenges and situations presented by our rapidly changing technologies, as well as how to accept responsibility for their actions.

As our parents taught us, no matter what the new fangled phone can do, or what social networks allow or don't allow, it is most important to strengthen and support the character of the individual holding the phone and sitting behind the keyboard.

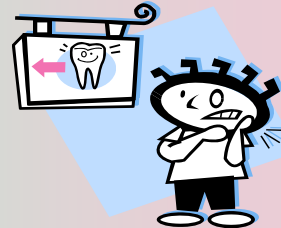
CONGRATULATIONS

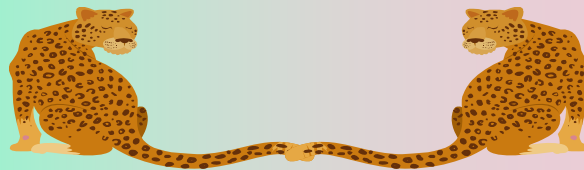

Yes No **Untreated Caries** — At least 1/2 mm of tooth structure loss at the enamel surface. Brown to dark-brown coloration of the walls of the lesion. These criteria apply to pit and fissure cavitated lesions as well as those on smooth tooth surfaces. If retained root, assume that the whole tooth was destroyed by caries. Broken or chipped teeth, plus teeth with temporary fillings, are considered sound unless a cavitated lesion is also present.

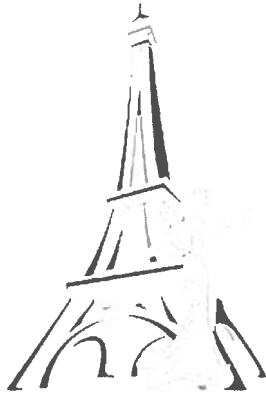
